When should we get started?

As soon as possible. There's no harm in being comfortable with your dance ahead of time. Couples often bring a video camera to lessons so that they can continue to practice on their own using the recording as a reference. A refresher lesson close to the wedding day is great too.

How many lessons will we need?

It depends on previous experience, your aptitude for dance, the song you choose, and how elaborate you want to be. Ideally, couples take a 4-week group class and 6-8 hours of private lessons. If you are short on time, just remember that your dancing will improve with every lesson. Many couples take additional lessons thinking they'd like to be able to dance to more songs than just their "first dance."

What songs can we use for our first dance?

If you have a favorite song that expresses your love exactly the right way, then use it! Even if it doesn't fit the standard dances, there are variations and adaptations to try. Together, we'll find something that works for you. Some songs are more difficult than others, but if you are willing to put in the effort, any song is "dancable".

If you don't have a song in mind, look inside for a list of some favorite songs that are both romantic and fun to dance to.

Can we really look good on the dance floor?

Absolutely. After your dance lessons, you'll look good and have fun doing it.

To begin, keep the dance simple and allow for plenty of time to practice. Your first lesson will start with something as simple as "step forward on your left foot." Slowly, you'll learn the special skills that will improve the look and feel of your dancing. No one is born knowing how to dance: that's why we take lessons!

Is it true that some couples are scrapping the traditional slow song in favor of something more up-beat?

It's true. Some couples choose Swing, Hustle, or even Cha Cha as their first or last dance. However, the majority of couples still favor a slow song, but try to find one that is special to them in some way.

How do we get started?

First, talk to your sweetheart. Decide which suits you best: group classes (safety in numbers) or private lessons (more one-on-one instruction). Decide if you would like to involve your families or your wedding party in lessons.
